All students will be picked-up and dropped-off in the gym, with the exception of Kindergarten camp which will be dropped off in the classroom. **All students must be signed in and out of camp.** There will be no carpool for camp.

St. George School Summer Camp Information

Here is some important information you should know prior to the first day of camp:

- **Food:** Unless students are staying for Lunch Bunch, there should be no food brought to camp. If they are staying for Lunch Bunch, all food should be kept in their lunch boxes. Also, please remember not to bring any nut products to campus.
- **Drinks:** We encourage students to bring water bottles to camp; however, camp teachers and St. George are not liable for any lost water bottles if they are left at camp. Water is the only drink that will be allowed during camp. If your student is staying for Lunch Bunch they can bring juice, tea, etc., but it must stay in their lunch box until then.
- **Cell phones and electronics:** We understand that some of our campers may need to bring a cell phone for emergencies, but please do not send cell phones if they are not absolutely necessary, and do not send any other electronics to camp with your child. To ensure that phones are not lost or used at inappropriate times, the teachers will collect phones (turned on silent or off completely) at the beginning of the day and pass them back out after the camp day is over.
- **Drop Off/Pick Up:** All students must be signed in and out of camp at the Gym. Teachers will be in the Gym 15 minutes before and after camp. If you arrive to camp past the start time, a parent must walk the student to the classroom where their camp is being held, which should be on your camp specific information sheet. Unless your child is staying for Lunch Bunch it is important that your child is picked up from the Gym no later than 15 minutes after camp ends.
- **Camp attire:** Please do not send your child to camp in flip flops or sandals. We need everyone to wear closed toe shoes. Sneakers are preferable because we will be doing lots of movement. While skirts and dresses are technically allowed, we do ask that shorts are worn underneath, due to the amount of movement we will do during camp.
- **Allergies:** If you did not list allergies or special medical information on your child's information sheet, please email your camp teachers this information immediately. Also, remember to send any important medical items that your child may need, such as an EpiPen. There will not be a nurse on campus during camps, so if there is anything specific to your child, please make sure your teachers are aware of this as soon as possible.
- **Camp Specifics:** After the registration deadline ends, May 4th, teachers will be sending you individual emails specific to their camp. Please make sure to reference those sheets, as well as this one, so that your child is as prepared as they possibly can be for a fun filled week at St. George!
